Deputy Director, National Institute of Biomedical Imaging and Bioengineering

POSITION: The National Institute of Biomedical Imaging and Bioengineering (NIBIB), a component of the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), is seeking exceptional candidates for the position of Deputy Director, NIBIB. NIBIB is responsible for a national and international program to conduct and support research, training, health information dissemination, and other programs with respect to the development and application of emerging medical technologies. These activities are conducted in hundreds of extramural laboratories and clinics, throughout the United States and in NIBIB's own facilities in Bethesda, Maryland.

The Deputy Director, NIBIB, serves as principal advisor to the Director, NIBIB, in evaluating, planning, directing, and coordinating all activities related to the mission and function of the Institute. Responsibilities also include the development and execution of policies, and assistance in the allocation of resources to carry out these policies. On behalf of the Director, NIBIB, the Deputy Director represents NIBIB in all matters involved in optimizing the intellectual and administrative environment at the Institute. The Deputy Director also supports the Director in serving as an ambassador and spokesperson for the Institute.

LOCATION: Bethesda, Maryland

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED: Applicants must possess a Ph.D., M.D., or equivalent doctoral degree in the biomedical sciences, with broad senior-level research experience and experience in direct administration of a research program. Applicants should be known and respected within their profession, both nationally and internationally, as distinguished individuals of outstanding scientific competence and administrative capability. Candidates should have demonstrated leadership; experience as a spokesperson; experience in program planning, program assessment, and analysis of program objectives; experience in resolution of operational problems and issues; and the ability to manage financial and human resources including building, motivating, and maintaining a culturally diverse staff.

SALARY/BENEFITS: The Deputy Director, NIBIB will be appointed at a salary commensurate with his/her qualifications and experience, and a full Federal benefits package is available, including: retirement, health and life insurance, long term care insurance, leave, and savings plan (401K equivalent).
