**Where:** Best Western Seven Seas (411 Hotel Circle South, San Diego, 92108)

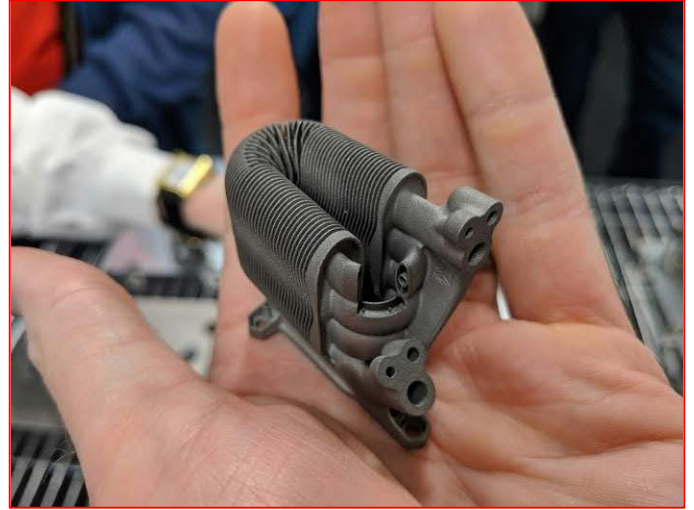
